## Modifiers – Misplaced & Dangling

### Misplaced Modifiers

Misplaced modifiers are words that, because of their placement, confuse the meaning of a sentence. Words should be placed as closely as possible to what they describe.

Examples:

#### Misplaced modifier

The students could see the shuttle launch from the school.

#### Correct

From the school, the students could see the shuttle launch.

#### Explanation

The shuttle did not launch from the school.

#### Misplaced modifier

We had a pizza after the movie that was delicious.

#### Correct

After the movie, we had a pizza that was delicious.

#### Explanation

It was not the movie that was delicious.

#### Misplaced modifier

She returned the fruit to the market that was spoiled.

#### Correct

She returned the fruit that was spoiled to the market.

### Explanation

It was not the market that was spoiled.

#### Misplaced modifier

He bought a doughnut from the bakery filled with jelly.

#### Correct

He bought a doughnut filled with jelly from the bakery.

#### Explanation

It was not a bakery filled with jelly.

### Dangling Modifiers

Modifying words or groups of words that open a sentence should be followed as closely as possible by the word that they describe.

Examples:

#### Dangling modifier

While sleeping soundly, the alarm clock awakened Mary.

#### Correct

While sleeping soundly, Mary was awakened by the alarm clock.

#### Explanation

It was not the alarm clock that was sleeping soundly.

#### Dangling modifier

Swinging from a giant tire, the tourists were delighted by the gorilla.

## Correct

Swinging from a giant tire, the gorilla delighted the tourists.

## Explanation

It was not the tourists who were swinging from a giant tire.

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## Dangling modifier

Walking through the woods, ticks covered my ankles.

## Correct

Walking through the woods, I discovered ticks covering my ankles.

## Explanation

It was not ticks walking through the woods.

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## Dangling modifier

After working hard all day in the sun, a cold drink tasted good.

## Correct

After working hard all day in the sun, we were ready for a cold drink.

## Explanation

The drink did not work hard all day in the sun.

Many of the modifiers in the following examples are misplaced, distorting the writer's intended meaning of the sentences. If the sentence contains a **misplaced modifier**, label it **MM** and **under-line the misplaced modifier**. If the sentence is correct, label it **C**.

MM 1. The students watched the bears looking through binoculars.

MM 2. She saw a roach opening the refrigerator door.

MM 3. Tickets have gone on sale for the play in the college box office.

MM 4. The clerk asked for the money with a frown.

MM 5. Sandra had her photographs blown up in an envelope.

C 6. She met him in the gym for a pep rally.

MM 7. Tickets have gone on sale for the concert in the bookstore.

MM 8. Sandy tripped and broke her wrist on her bell bottom jeans.

MM 9. The boys found a pizza place driving around in their car.

MM 10. I read that Sam Smith was a scientist who launched a rocket in the library.

MM 11. She bought a cake from the bakery with chocolate icing.

MM 12. He thought about his lost baseball glove driving home.

MM 13. I returned the shirt to the store that my mother gave me.

C 14. Garlic should be stored in a sealed bag in the refrigerator.

C 15. With a smile, she accepted the ring.

Most of the modifiers in the following sentences are dangling because they do not really modify anything in the sentence. If the sentence contains a **dangling modifier**, label it **DM** and underline the dangling modifier. If the sentence is correct, label it **C**.

- DM 1. Sealed in an envelope, I couldn't read the message.
- DM 2. Wading into the stream, a snake swam between my feet.
- C 3. Soaked in sweat, Sam was hot and thirsty.
- DM 4. Hanging on the wall, I read his diploma.
- DM 5. Sitting quietly, the book kept her attention.
- C 6. Hot and sizzling, the hamburgers tasted great.
- DM 7. After sleeping on the open ground, a cot was a welcome change.

- DM 8. Catching the pass on the run, the fans cheered when he scored.
